



Annual Report for 2017

In 2017, BEBA continued supporting families in the Ojai and Santa Barbara family clinics, where facilitators saw families about once a week in sessions lasting approximately one hour. Families come for as long as it takes to resolve issues and traumatic imprinting and until they have effective parenting skills so they can continue on their own with occasional support. Several families who brought their children in as babies have returned as the need arose for anywhere from one to ongoing regular sessions. In 2017, BEBA also held its quarterly parenting workshops.

Family Sessions at the BEBA Clinics

BEBA Facilitators provided a total of 129 sessions in 2017 (124 sessions in 2016) averaging 70 minutes.

- The Ojai BEBA Clinic provided 61 family sessions and 23 phone or skype sessions.
- The Santa Barbara BEBA Clinic provided 36 family sessions and 9 phone or skype sessions.

The family clinic operated on a sliding scale based on income with a per hour charge varying from \$30/hour to \$140/hour. Clients were charged an average of \$64/ hour.

24 families came to BEBA in 2017 (24 in 2016): 60 individuals including 23 children and their parents. 9 of these families started in 2017; 15 started before 2017. Between January 1993, when BEBA started, and Dec 31, 2017, BEBA has served a total of 231 families.

Demographics of Families in the Family Clinic

The following is a breakdown of families seen in 2017 by annual income:

- 17% of the sessions were with families with annual incomes up to \$30,000.
- 43% of the sessions were with families with annual incomes over \$30,000 to \$60,000.
- 30% of the sessions were with families with annual incomes over \$60,000 to \$90,000.
- 10% of the sessions were with families with annual incomes over \$100,000.

Community Outreach

BEBA began offering a 4 part class series in the fall of 2012 at the Santa Barbara Clinic. In 2017, BEBA offered a Spring class series at the Ojai BEBA Clinic and a Fall class series at the new Santa Barbara BEBA Clinic on a range of topics. In 2017, the Spring class series included a class on Co-Operating with a Co-Parent and Attachment parenting. The Fall 2017 series covered deepening family connection, handling challenging emotions and preparing for birth. The classes were taught by Ray Castellino, Tara Blasco, Mary Jackson, Frank Carbone, Moriah Whoolilurie, Keri Starbuck and Alex Lobba. Classes had between 5 and 10 participants that paid \$5-\$20 per class.

Santa Barbara Clinic

This was BEBA's last year at the Santa Barbara clinic located at 226 E. Canon Perdido, Ste K in the heart of downtown Santa Barbara. Longtime BEBA family and supporters, The Prudden's, offered their home as a new BEBA Clinic location and sessions began there in April of 2017. This clinic was offered to BEBA rent free. Tara Blasco has offered sessions at this clinic. The BEBA room is filled with a comfortable rug, toys, balls, tunnels, pillows, etc.

Ojai Clinic

Since September 2004, BEBA has operated a second clinic in Ojai at the home of BEBA Facilitator, Co-Director and Board Member, Tara Blasco. Tara and Frank offered sessions there and staff meetings were held there. The rent for this branch of BEBA is provided free of charge. It consists of a playroom complete with gym mats, tunnels, toys, pillows etc.

Clinical Staff

The experience and training of all staff is extensive. All assistants have completed Raymond Castellino's 2+ year Foundation Training (see www.castellinotraining.com/foundation/) and are certified craniosacral therapists in training or fully trained (see www.craniosacraltherapy.org/). All co-facilitators and facilitators have either assisted or are assisting another 2+ year Foundation Training. In addition, those who have become assistant facilitators have videotaped prior to that 100-300 family sessions.

The clinical staff included 6 people: 2 Clinic Co-Directors, 2 Facilitators, 1 Bookkeeper & Administrative Assistant and 1 Volunteer Videographer.

Raymond Castellino, D.C., RCST®, and Tara Blasco, Ph.D., RCST® served as the volunteer Co-Directors who provided supervision on behalf of the Board of Directors. Tara Blasco continued being a paid facilitator and Frank Carbone began his first year as a paid facilitator.

Tara Blasco, Ph.D., RCST® offered sessions on Tuesdays in Santa Barbara and Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays in Ojai. Frank Carbone also offered sessions at the Ojai clinic.

Amy Joy Bakken, who holds two AA degrees in Accounting and Business Administration, continues to be BEBA's Bookkeeper and Administrator. She continues to contribute part time to BEBA in charge of bookkeeping, payroll, billing, marketing, record keeping and initial family intake.

Mimi Oliver was the videographer during the year.

The board of directors in 2017 included Mary Jackson as President, Vicki Diloia as secretary, Alexis Baxley as treasurer, Heidi DeBra, Moriah Whoolilurie, Raymond Castellino and Tara Blasco.

Fundraising & Financials

BEBA fundraised \$8,656 in 2017. This included \$5,000 in donations from BEBA's Board of Directors.
